THE NETHERLANDS

If you like football, you probably know that orange is Holland's national colour. And even if you do not like football, you probably know all the stereotypes of the Netherlands as a flat country with a lot of water, bridges, dykes, polders, windmills, tulips and cheese, more bicycles than people. But there is much more to the Netherlands than these common clichés.

THE GATEWAY TO EUROPE

The Netherlands is one of the European Union's most dynamic centres of trade and industry. In fact, it is the seventeenth largest economy in the world and one of the world's topten export nations. The Port of Rotterdam is the largest in Europe, making the Netherlands a transportation centre for the whole of Western Europe, which is why the Netherlands is often called the Gateway to Europe.

EXPERT IN WATER MANAGEMENT

The Netherlands also has a large number of world-renowned research institutes, particularly in the field of water management. With a quarter of their land below sea level, the Dutch have fought the sea for centuries. Nowadays, Dutch companies export their expertise in water conservation and land-reclamation projects to the rest of the world. The Delta Works Storm Surge Barrier, one of the engineering wonders of the modern world, can be found on the eastern section of the River Scheldt in the province of Zeeland.

DUTCH HIGHER-EDUCATION SYSTEM

The Netherlands has two types of universities:

- Universities of Applied Sciences, which provide students with theoretical education, but also focus on using the knowledge in professional projects and applied research.
- Academic Universities, which are more geared to theoretical studies and research.



At HZ University of Applied Sciences you will receive theoretical training, but will also carry out practical assignments and take internships to prepare for jobs that require a higher professional qualification. The practical component therefore plays an extremely important part in our study programmes.

ZEELAND

THE MOST POPULAR TOURIST REGION IN THE NETHERLANDS

Zeeland is one of the twelve Dutch provinces. It is in the south-west of the country and its southern boundary forms part of the Dutch-Belgian border. In this wonderful, water-dominated province, you will find beautiful scenery, endless beaches and picturesque ancient villages, which attract thousands of tourists each year.

RECREATION AND TOURISM

Zeeland is well-known for its stunning countryside and natural beauty. With its spectacular coastline and wide beaches, Zeeland is a paradise for water-sports enthusiasts. Attractions include the historic towns of Middelburg, Zierikzee, Veere and Vlissingen. A large number of hotels, group accommodation centres, holiday villages, campsites and wellness resorts welcome the growing tourist population.

ECONOMY

Although tourism is an important source of income for many of Zeeland's residents, the majority of jobs are to be found in industry and the services sector. The heart of Zeeland's economy is in the industrial areas in and around the ports of Vlissingen and Terneuzen. Multinationals such as Dow Chemical Company, Total, Eastman Chemical and McCain all have facilities in Zeeland.

GETTING AROUND

The province of Zeeland consists of islands interconnected by dams, bridges and tunnels. The towns are close to each other, making travel by bicycle easy. However, the Netherlands is also renowned for its public-transport system and if you venture outside Zeeland to explore the rest of the country, you will soon discover how excellent it really is.



VLISSINGEN

Vlissingen is a medium-sized tourist and student town with some 45,000 inhabitants. With its beautiful beach, scenic promenade and many pavement cafés, the town exudes a constant holiday vibe. Various festivals of international reputation, such as the Liberation Day Festival, the 'Onderstroom' Festival and Film by the Sea, have firmly put Vlissingen on the map. The railway station is within walking distance of the HZ building. So you can rest assured: Vlissingen has everything to make your student days a fantastic experience.







HZ University of Applied Sciences, with a population of some 4,500 students, is international in outlook. Our slogan 'where students matter' is not just empty words. As soon as you walk through our doors, you will feel at home from the word go.

The Keuzegids Hoger Onderwijs guide to higher education conducts an annual survey of higher education in the Netherlands. In its 2014 survey, it named HZ University of Applied Sciences the best multidisciplinary University of Applied Sciences. HZ ranked highly for the quality and accessibility of its lecturers and the small student groups. Furthermore, its classrooms, workspaces and computer facilities were rated excellent.

ACCREDITATION

The Dutch higher education system enjoys a worldwide reputation for its outstanding quality. It is monitored by a national system of regulation and quality assurance.

The quality of university departments and programmes is regularly assessed by the Ministry of Education, Culture and Science as well as the Accreditation Organisation of the Netherlands and Flanders (Nederlands-Vlaamse Accreditatieorganisatie; NVAO).

All HZ's Bachelor's programmes have been accredited and are listed in the Central Register of Higher Education Study Programmes (CROHO).

HZ is one of the first Dutch universities of applied sciences to have been awarded NVAO institutional accreditation. The institutional audit emphasized HZ's excellent record as an educational institution.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of Conduct sets out standards for Dutch higher-education institutions in their dealings with international students. One of the most important conditions is to provide information that is timely, reliable and accessible. This specifically includes information such as accreditation status, quality and admission requirements as well as many important rules and procedures for international students. By signing the Code of Conduct, HZ is offering international students a guarantee of the quality of its programmes and of its student recruitment, selection and counselling procedures.

MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL OF INTERNATIONAL SCHOOLS

HZ University of Applied Sciences is a member of the Council of International Schools (CIS). This highlights HZ's commitment to high-quality international education. The CIS is a non-profit association of international schools and post-secondary institutions, which aims to improve international education. It defines quality standards and provides services that support the optimization of international education all over the world.

HZ STUDY PROGRAMMES LISTED ON THE NUFFIC WEBSITE

HZ's English-language programmes are recognised by Nuffic, the Netherlands organisation for international cooperation in higher education (www.nuffic.nl), which is yet another guarantee of the quality of its education.



PROBLEM-BASED LEARNING

At HZ you are trained to analyse and solve practical problems, both independently and in a team. During your four-year programme, you will become acquainted with the problembased approach. This involves coming up with solutions to real-life problems from the professional field for which you are being trained. You will be supervised by tutors and will study the theoretical background.

MINOR

You will spend a semester in the third or fourth year of your programme pursuing a minor. Minors allow you to gain a deeper or a broader understanding of your professional field. Your minor is based on your own interests and the competences you have acquired so far. You may pursue this minor at HZ or at one of HZ's partner institutions in the Netherlands or abroad.

STUDENT STORY

MARITA, FROM AUSTRIA, STUDYING CHEMISTRY AT HZ

I decided to study in the Netherlands because of its reputation as an openminded and innovative country. A major aspect of my studies is how to apply environmental issues and sustainable thinking to practical situations. Furthermore, HZ organises a lot of events to bring international students together, which creates an international but also homely atmosphere.



PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Do I have the right qualifications to study at HZ? How much does it cost? Can I visit HZ? These are usually the first questions prospective students ask us. Here are the answers to these frequently asked questions.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for admission, you must meet the general admission requirements together with any specific requirements for your chosen programme. As a rule, to enrol in one of our four-year Bachelor's programmes, you will need:

- A diploma equivalent to the Dutch Secondary Education
 Diploma, which gives you access to higher education.
 You can find a list of admissible diplomas on our website:
 www.hz.nl/en;
- A good command of written and spoken English. Your English should be the equivalent of an IELTS score of 6.0.

Depending on your chosen Bachelor's programme, you may need to meet additional requirements. The specific requirements can be found in the description of the various programmes in seperate leaflets and on our website: www.hz.nl/en.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

If you would like to study at HZ, you can apply through Studielink, the online application system for higher education in the Netherlands, wwww.studielink.nl.

We strongly advise you to apply before 1 May. The closing date for application is 15 June for non-EU students and 15 July for EU-students.

If you have any questions regarding the enrolment procedure, tuition fees or visa request, please contact the International Student Administration isa@hz.nl.

STUDENT ACCOMMODATION

Most students live in student accommodation in or near the town centre and within cycling distance of HZ. The accommodation is furnished and equipped with an internet connection. Rents usually range from $\ensuremath{\in} 275$ to $\ensuremath{\in} 450$ per month. Accommodation varies from single units to three to nine-bedroom apartments with shared kitchen and bathroom facilities.



WHY STUDY AT HZ?

If you choose our university of applied sciences, you are opting for more than just professional training, because at HZ you are encouraged to make the most of your abilities. With us you can count on optimal coaching in a small-scale degree programme with a practical focus.



STUDENT-FOCUSED

HZ places great emphasis on coaching individual students. The staff know you personally. You have your own career counsellor who will help you choose course units and explore your career possibilities. Classes are small and the lecturers and tutors are readily available to provide help when you need it. HZ also has a number of facilities and individual services for students with a disability or chronic illness.

QUALITY

HZ programmes excel in both their theoretical and practical content; 18 of the 25 HZ Bachelor's programmes are in the national top three (national survey, Keuzegids Hoger Onderwijs guide to higher education 2014). All HZ study programmes are practice-based and geared to the job market. In addition to the regular lectures, you go on field trips and company visits, do practical assignments and study subjects that are directly linked to the professional reality. At HZ, you will start building a large international network. Your fellow students come from all over the world. In addition, we offer a wide range of study or internship opportunities to study all over the world.

Apart from studying hard, you also need time to relax and enjoy student life. In Vlissingen everything you need for when you are not studying is within cycling distance of home: shops, bars, the beach and the various extracurricular activities at HZ itself.

STUDENT ASSOCIATIONS

HZ's student associations offer a wide variety of activities from a weekly dinner in town to the annual gala evening to a sunset cruise party. Each student association has its own identity and organises its own events. You will receive information about the various associations and their activities during the Introduction Week.

HZ SPORT

For all sporting activities in and around Vlissingen, you can join the university sports club, HZ Sport. You are always welcome to take part in the weekly sports programme with sports such as tennis, volleyball, indoor and outdoor football, swimming and much more. As a member of HZ Sport, you get discounts on other activities such as kite surfing, climbing, go karting and mountain biking. FINDING A SUITABLE INTERNSHIP

HZ has built up a broad network of companies. This offers you great opportunities for practical assignments and internships.

You are responsible for selecting the company where you would like to take your internship, but TWZ, our professional recruitment agency, and the International Office will provide assistance with your application.

- TWZ is the intermediary between students, graduates and companies, and arranges internships in the Netherlands.
- The International Office assists you in applying for internships abroad.

These two semesters of work experience during your studies at HZ improve your chances of finding a good job when you graduate. Many graduates move up to a management-level position within a couple of years.

CLOSE COOPERATION WITH THE BUSINESS WORLD

Representatives from our partner companies advise on the development of our study programmes and also provide excellent internship opportunities. The experience of the corporate culture at different companies that you gain during your studies will boost your professional success.

TWO INTERNSHIPS

Our Bachelor's programmes comprise eight semesters, two of which you will spend working at a company. You will be supervised by an in-company mentor and an HZ tutor during these two internships and will become familiar with professional practice in trade and industry.

We distinguish between two types of internship:

- Introductory internship: during this first internship, you gain practical experience and learn to apply your theoretical knowledge in a work situation.
- Final research project (final semester of your studies):
 during this graduation internship, you apply your theoretical knowledge and practical skills to analyse and solve
 a company-based problem. You explain your suggested
 solutions, which must be of such a nature that the
 company can actually implement them, in a report and
 presentation.

The U.S. Commercial Service in Belgium has worked with HZ on its internship programme for many years now. HZ students are very conscientious, friendly and always willing to assist the Commercial Service team in all its activities. Their analytical, research and organization skills, in combination with a positive, friendly, and cooperative attitude, are a true asset to the U.S. Commercial Service in Belgium.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP - STUDENT COMPANY

During your studies at HZ, you will be encouraged to develop your skills in product development, innovation and entrepreneurship.

As a second-year student of our Business or Engineering departments, you will therefore set up and run your own company for a year. The course unit "Student Company" gives you all the practical tools you need to manage your own company. With four or five other students, you will think of a product and market it. You will have to find the most effective tools and the best strategy to successfully operate within the market. You may choose to wind up your company once you have finished the programme. However, it's quite common for student companies to be so successful that they actually continue after the programme has been officially concluded.

ZEEUWSE BELLE COMPANY (ZBC) IS A TREMENDOUS SUCCESS

The ZBC student company was so successful that four students from this student company decided to continue with the business. It all started with the idea of designing a bicycle bell in the shape of a traditional piece of jewellery from Zeeland. "I had never thought of starting my own business before. Now I would not consider anything else" says Leonard, one of our now experienced entrepreneurs. In one-and-a-half years, they already sold more than 17,000 of their bells. In addition to commercial success, they won the Baaz Press Prize for the best media campaign. in the National Finals for Young Enterprises in June 2013.



HZ APPLIED RESEARCH CENTRES

HZ's Applied Research Centres maintain close contact with their respective professional fields by integrating company projects into the study programmes. This strong commitment to the business world allows us to keep up with industry practice and developments. Having worked on one of these projects during your studies will definitely enhance your career prospects upon graduation.

ZANINA, FROM BULGARIA ONE SEMESTER APPLIED RESEARCH AT HZ AND ONE SEMESTER INTERNSHIP IN AUSTRALIA

In my third year of Water Management, I was offered the opportunity to do a research minor. I chose to do this in the Delta Academy Water Technology research group. The water company Evides asked me to optimize a process in the ion exchange demi-water production system.

The implementation included background desk work and extensive laboratory work in cooperation with my supervisors. I enriched my knowledge of ion exchange, sampling methods and laboratory equipment. All this knowledge will certainly be very useful for my internship at a Water Research Centre in Australia. There, I will work on a similar project, but this time I will look into reverse osmosis installations.


STUDENT STORY

INTERNATIONAL BACHELOR'S PROGRAMMES

HZ offers nine full-time Bachelor's programmes in English. Our four-year Bachelor's programmes consist of six semesters of theoretical studies and two semesters of internships at a company.

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS AND MANAGEMENT STUDIES

IBMS focuses on Entrepreneurship, Sales, Marketing, Management and Financial Management. You will be trained to hold a position in international trade. Your extensive knowledge of organisations, management, commerce, and business economics will make you a professional negotiator at management level.

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS AND LANGUAGES

Language, culture, economy and tourism all join forces in the IBL Bachelor's programme. Upon graduating, you will be able to work in an international company where you will form the link between the company and its international environment. HZ's IBL study programme was named the best IBL Bachelor's programme in the Netherlands for four consecutive years (2011, 2012, 2013,2014 national surveys, Keuzegids Hoger Onderwijs guide to higher education).

VITALITY AND TOURISM MANAGEMENT

Nowadays, people are looking for more ways to improve their lifestyle, health and quality of life. The Vitality and Tourism Management Bachelor's programme trains you to translate these desires into products on the tourism market. The programme has a strong international orientation, and offers courses in Management, Tourism, Vitality and Wellness, Sports, Health, Human Resources Management and Hospitality. During the programme, you and your fellow students will work on projects that will call on you to analyse and solve professional problems.

WATER MANAGEMENT / AQUATIC ECOTECHNOLOGY

Aquatic EcoTechnology is the programme for you if you are interested in water, nature and the environment. It focuses on the diversity of water ecosystems, with Biology, Ecology and Technology as the core subject areas. You research how water can best be managed in urban, rural and industrial settings. Some 30% of the Bachelor's programme consists of fieldwork and practicals in our modern laboratories.

WATER MANAGEMENT/ DELTA MANAGEMENT

This Bachelor's programme is for you if you are interested in environmental studies and area development. As a delta or area manager, you will also need to take a helicopter view and consider the interests of multiple parties. The lectures focus on such topics as water, climate, ecology, environmental planning, legislation and regulations, economic insights, communications and process management. Demand for delta managers currently exceeds supply.

CIVIL ENGINEERING

Dutch engineers export their knowledge of coastal defence all over the world. At HZ, you learn how to plan, design and build in a safe, sustainable and cost-effective way. You specialise in coastal, hydraulic engineering and learn to apply this worldwide. You also learn to manage large-scale projects involving the construction or design of ports, bridges, roads and dykes. Similarly, you may be involved in projects constructing tunnels, islands and offshore airfields.

CHEMISTRY

There is a growing demand for chemists and molecular scientists. As an HZ graduate you will be well qualified for such jobs. In the first two years, you follow courses in general chemistry and biology, before choosing one of two specialisations: 'Applied Chemistry' or 'Life Sciences'. In Applied Chemistry you learn the chemical principles, processes and techniques that you can then apply in research, common instrumental separation and analysis. In Life Sciences you focus on subjects such as bacteriology, virology, epidemiology and immunobiology, the development of modern vaccines and the application of DNA techniques. Approximately 40% of the study consists of experiments in our laboratories.

LOGISTICS ENGINEERING

Logistics Engineering trains you as a Logistics Manager, a specialist who is in much demand and can consequently expect a good salary. A Logistics Manager has a thorough knowledge of physical distribution, transport, storage, human logistics, planning, communication and management. Logistics also entails working with large airports and seaports, developing international contacts and keeping an eye on your outgoings.

The HZ Logistics Engineering programme was named the best Applied Sciences Bachelor's programme Logistics Engineering in the 2014 national survey conducted by the Keuzegids Hoger Onderwijs guide to higher education.

INDUSTRIAL ENGINEERING AND MANAGEMENT/ INTERNATIONAL MAINTENANCE MANAGEMENT

In this programme, you specialise in the maintenance and management of capital goods such as aeroplanes, ships, roads and power plants. Technology, safety and sustainability are important aspects of IMM: you learn to make reliable predictions on operating life and asset replacement. You also learn to assess safety risks and maintenance tenders. Business Administration will be your second area of expertise and you learn how to deal with planning and budgeting, cost analyses and logistical issues. Communication & Management forms another important part of the programme, with a focus on management processes and leadership in an international environment. In addition to regular lectures, you gain relevant practical experience and learn about real-life challenges in guest lectures from industry representatives, site visits, industrybased assignments and internships.
